## Curatorial and Gallery Assistant

Curatorial assistance will include research and record keeping tasks, and other duties as assigned. Public facing tasks may include leading tours, answering questions from guests, and monitoring the gallery spaces.

The ideal candidate for this position will be pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree or a bachelor's degree in another arts related field. They will have excellent organizational and planning skills with demonstrated ability to meet multiple deadlines, competency in MacOSX, Microsoft Office and Adobe suites, as well as excellent verbal and written communication skills in English. Fluency in French is considered an asset but is not required.

- are between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment;
- are willing to commit to the full duration of the work assignment;
- will not have another full-time job (over 30 hours a week) during the Young Canada Works (YCW) work assignment;
- have been a full-time high school, college, CEGEP or university student (as defined by their educational institution) in the semester preceding the YCW work assignment; and
- intend to return to full-time studies in the semester following the YCW work assignment.
