So a couple of months ago a 10 year old girl came in who uses a wheelchair, a super cool wheelchair that was made just for her.

No it was amazing. Actually she came in to tell us about when her Grandma passed away.

Oh, that's awful.

Tanny

Oof I know, but that's not even the most awful part of the story. When she and her family went to the funeral the elevator to the main room wasn't working, and she couldn't go in with the rest of her family. Instead she had to wait in this other room with her Dad and a bunch of sandwiches she wasn't allowed to eat. And her Dad was so sad and crying and she was feeling so sad and ashamed and like it was her fault.

That's so sad. But like... how could you help her with that?

First we asked what happened next, because the story didn't need to end at the saddest part. We just kept asking, what happened next, and then what and then what, feeling for sure that we could eventually make our way to a happier ending.
